Documentary follows PPM in Hong Kong.

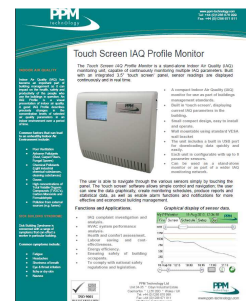

Calls for improvements to EPA's draft health assessment for formaldehyde.

A U.S. Environmental Protection Agency draft assessment of the potential health effects of formaldehyde exposure needs substantial revision, says a new report from the National Research Council. They claim the draft assessment has not adequately supported its conclusions that formaldehyde causes other cancers of the respiratory tract, leukaemia, or several other non-cancer health outcomes. Portuguese guidelines set maximum permissible concentrations for IAQ parameters.

Government body 'Certificacao Energetica e Ar Interior EDIFICIOS' (National Energy and Indoor Air Quality Certification) have introduced the guideline to ensure building occupants are not exposed to dangerous concentrations of gases and compounds such as Formaldehyde, Ozone, TVOC's, Carbon Dioxide and Carbon Monoxide.

New guideline identifies interactions affecting indoor environmental quality.

The American Society for Heating Refrigeration and Air-Conditioning (ASHRAE) have recently published new guidelines relating to the interactions affecting Indoor Environmental Quality, the guidelines provides guidance on achieving good indoor environments by considering the interactions of air quality and thermal conditions, as well as lighting and acoustics - [Read More...](#)

A popular hair smoothing treatment called Brazilian Blowout can release unsafe levels of the chemical formaldehyde, posing a risk to hair salon workers and their customers.
